LIVES SAVED, LIVES REDEEMED

For more than twenty-two years now, New Beginnings has served as a rescue for animals in our county. Believe it—that has given us plenty to do! On occasion however, when we can, we have become involved in emergency situations in nearby areas outside of Merced County. Such was the case when we recently assisted with two hoarding locations in Ceres.

It all began in late November when Sharon was contacted by two people, one from the Stanislaus County Animal Shelter and the other a concerned citizen. Both contacts were in relation to two sites with overwhelming numbers of chihuahuas, and there were hopes that we could help retrieve and rehome them.

In the first location the renter had been evicted and the property owner had been seeking help for over six months. These unfortunate critters were living in a house, garage and back yard but were used to roaming freely all over, ending disastrously for some. In the second location we were only able to make a small dent in the problem because the owner was uncooperative and unwilling to change his ways. In either location, none were socialized. All were terrified. Not a recipe for an uncomplicated seizure. For sure, there was not one who was inclined to jump into its rescuer's arms! Instead, the three people who accompanied Sharon on this venture had to chase them into a corner and encase them in a blanket, not only to ease capture but to prevent biting.

Over the course of three days, thirty-six little "Chis" started on their journey to being a cherished member of a loving family. The first day Sharon and her team nabbed thirteen from one location and ten from the other, a total of twenty-three wriggling, nipping, whirling cyclones. Two days later, ten more. Awaiting them at Sharon's were twenty welcoming angels (otherwise known as fosters). Since the dogs had been in tribes that functioned together, the goal was for each one to have at least one buddy initially. Before going home with a foster, each one was vaccinated and an attempt was made to assess its teeth. Then, they left with a caregiver armed with food, bedding, toys and a boatload of nurturing spirit and determination. It's impossible to say too much about these fosters. They knew they were entering into a long-term commitment with ill-mannered things that could injure them, but they agreed to it anyway!

Special thanks are also due to the people at River Oak Veterinary Hospital who performed free spay-neuters, dental procedures, flea treatments and vaccinations, fitting in as many as they could into their already busy schedule. They were able to do quite a few and then New Beginnings assumed the cost for the others. (Continued page 2)

Now for the rest of the story. Our fosters accomplished what they aimed to do, turning wild objects into adoring tail wagers. In early January ten were transported, including two moms with puppies. Seven were adopted at an adoption event at Petco, with the adopters agreeing to continue the little bit of socialization they still needed. Still others were continuing their "education" with their fosters but are ready for their new families now.

Some might wonder why we do this when we know it will involve an inordinate amount of time, effort and funds. Well, as long as we are able, how can we not? If we can make this world a little better for someone, why wouldn't we? Our motto is, "Turning Compassion Into Action." That's exactly what was going on here.
